Established in 1870, predating Utah's statehood by 26 years.

Growth, education and outreach have been in constant focus, starting schools, adding wings, congregational space, and providing food, time, and materials for those in need. Church members designed and built the Latino Congregation's Chapel. It was consecrated in 2013.



The sanctuary was built in 1874 and is the oldest continuously occupied building in the city.



Tuttle Hall was built in 1906 and named for the missionary first Bishop of Utah, Idaho, and Montana



A modern new wing was added to the east side in 2010, adding classrooms and a nursery

Our Mission:

To spread the love and hope Jesus offers to all who yearn to be welcomed home to the family of God in worship and fellowship.

Our Vision

To help people find God's love, grow their faith, discover their purpose and improve the lives of those in our church and community

Who we are

- Our membership originates from as much as 45 min. distant and consists of diverse faith backgrounds, ethnicities, socio-economic status, interests, skills, and abilities. We come from Utah, but also through other states due to nearby Weber State University, Hill Air Force Base, and relocations due to retirement or a growing list of companies that have located in or near Ogden.
- Our one parish houses two worship congregations who look for Christ in others and try to bring Christ into our lives and interactions.
- We are committed to look for the face of the Lord Jesus in everyone we meet and to serve others so that everyone we meet will see the face of the Lord Jesus in us.
- We value worship, having lay-lead Morning Prayer twice a week and Compline Monday evening.
- We strongly foster in-reach and outreach having many ministries devoted to serving others and each other.

Shepherd's Bowl



About 150 lunches are given out every Wednesday from the basement of Good Shepherd to those in need.

Shepherd's Fold

Provides pillows, sheets, and blankets to those transitioning from homeless to housed.



Family Promise

Good Shepherd's Deacon holds a position on the board.



Lantern House

Starting as a soup kitchen in the '70's, Good Shepherd teamed with Catholic and Lutheran churches which grew to a homeless shelter by 1981, later evolving to St. Anne's Center as a full-service shelter and as Lantern House in 2015. Up to 330 homeless can be housed, fed, counseled, and provided medical care. Good Shepherd maintains a presence on the Board.



Youth Impact

30 years ago, we began a program for youth ministry in our basement which grew and today more than 100 youth from inner-city Ogden are picked up at school, fed, have a place to do homework, attend classes and sports. Our members have been on the Board and held Executive Directorship for 28 years.



Good Shepherd believes in and practices caring not only for our own fold, but for all of God's children in our community. We have done so for many years and several of the initiatives our members began are still active and successful today.



GROWING LATINO CONGREGATION

 confirmations and 8 first
 communions in the first three
 months of 2023
- Average attendance is 52 and growing

- 2022 Successful roof replacement in record time
- 2022 Supplemented grid with solar power during roof renovation
- 2022 Installed new kitchen facility to aid in parish events and outreach meals
- Added Latino chapel for Spanishspoken worship 2013
- Added new wing for classrooms 2010
